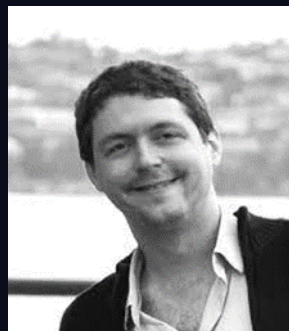

Dr. Félix-Antoine Bérubé

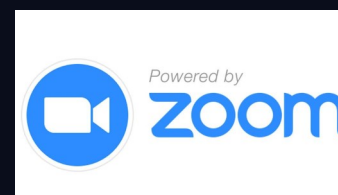
Félix-Antoine Bérubé is assistant professor at the Department of psychiatry and addictology of the University of Montreal. He is actively involved in medical education both at the pre and post-graduate levels. Since 2014 he is clerkship director for psychiatry at the Université of Montréal. After his psychiatric training he did his fellowship at the HYPE clinic in Melbourne, Australia, specializing in early intervention for borderline personality disorder (BPD). He is medical chief of the Connec-T clinic in Montreal, offering early intervention in BPD, and also works as a psychiatrist at the Relational and Personality disorders Service, both clinics being parts of the Mental Health University Institute of Montreal.
