
CPA honours outstanding contributions to psychiatry at the annual conference


Last week, the CPA welcomed delegates from across the country to the annual conference in Toronto—the first inperson conference since 2019. Thank you for helping to make the conference a success.

In addition to a jam-packed scientific program, the conference was an opportunity to recognize CPA members for their outstanding contributions to psychiatry and to the mental health of Canadians.

During the president's dinner and awards gala on Oct. 29, Dr. Urness conferred the CPA's highest award, a **President's Commendation**, to two leaders:

- Dr. Cornelia (Nel) Wieman for her leadership and powerful voice in advocating for an end to racist attitudes and behaviours in the patient clinical care experience, in medical culture, and at the societal level more broadly, and
- Dr. Donald Addington for a lifetime of contributions to psychiatry as a tireless teacher, academic, clinician, mentor and leader, as well as his extensive involvement with CPA.





Dr. Alexandre Hudon from Montreal received the Member-in-Training Award of Excellence in recognition
of his research delving into ways of combining digital artificial intelligence methods with clinical psychiatry,
as well as his commitment to issues related to residents' well-being.



- Dr. Naista Zhand from Ottawa was recognized with the Early Career Achievement in Psychiatry Award for her exemplary dedication to the clinical care of patients, as well her commitment to the enrichment of education.
- **Dr. Alexander McGirr** from Calgary was awarded the **Early Career Psychiatrist Research Award** for his contributions to our understanding of personality and genetic vulnerability factors in depression and suicide, as well as his work in neurostimulation in humans and cortical dynamics in mice.
- Dr. Pierre Blier from Ottawa received the J.M. Cleghorn Award for Excellence and Leadership in Clinical Research in recognition of his contributions to mood disorder research and advancements in treatment, most notably with early research in ketamine.
- **Dr. Paul Links** was recognized with the **C.A. Roberts Award for Clinical Leadership** for his contributions to suicide prevention and the management of patients with borderline personality disorder.
- Dr. Paula Ravitz was awarded the Paul Patterson Innovation in Education Leadership Award for her leadership in delivering accessible and culturally sensitive psychotherapy education.
